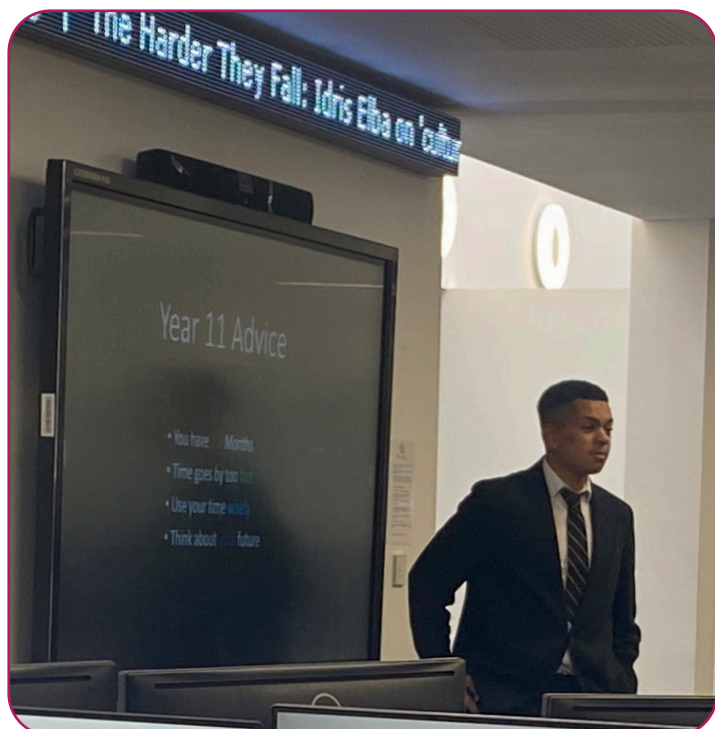


Revision with Year 11

She has traversed Europe for over four months, voyaging from Turkey and has reached UK shores in the final leg of an 8,000 kilometre journey, with the hope that 'The Walk' will bring much-needed attention to all those who seek refuge and shine a light on the millions of displaced refugee children Amal represents.

Little Amal will arrive at London on **Saturday 23rd October** where she will visit some of London's iconic landmarks including St Paul's Cathedral and Shakespeare's Globe before celebrating her 10th birthday with us at Camden Town on Sunday 24th October where the Roundhouse have planned a birthday party and concert in her honour as she bids farewell to London. Traffic Congestion outside the College
