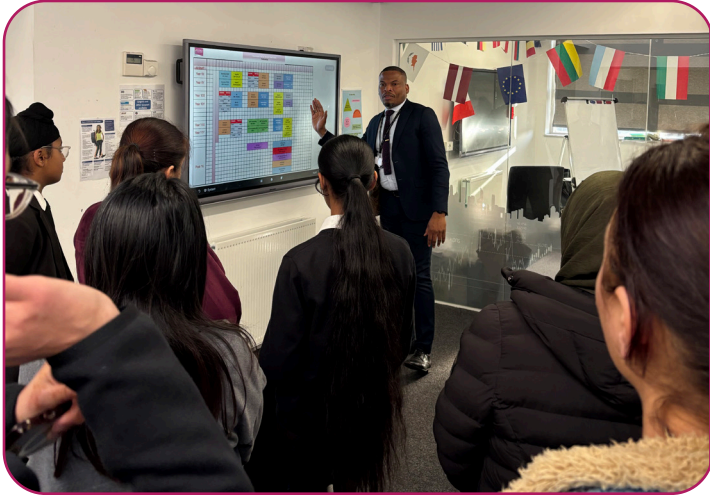


Prospective Student Tour and SLT Q&A

School Drop-Off & Pick-Up Safety – Important Information from Hillingdon Council

We have received updated guidance from the STaRS Team at Hillingdon Council regarding safe behaviour during school drop-off and pick-up times. The council has highlighted ongoing concerns about unsafe parking, congestion, and road safety around schools, and is asking all families to help create a safer, calmer environment for children and the wider community.

To support this, the STaRS Team has provided a detailed School Drop-Off & Pick-Up Safety Information Guide, which outlines important reminders about responsible driving, safe crossing points, and following road markings such as yellow zig-zags and double yellow lines.
