Alongside this important safety message, the Metropolitan Police are also offering free online workshops for parents, guardians and carers this summer, covering topics including child criminal exploitation, grooming, serious youth violence and knife crime awareness. These sessions provide practical advice on recognising risks, understanding warning signs and accessing support.
